

FRANCISCO T. DUQUE III
Chairman, Civil Service Commission

Government Service

- Recently, this 9th of March, Chairman Duque was elected Vice-Chairman of the Career Executive Service Board (CESB).
- Last February 22, 2010, Her Excellency Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, through the efforts of honorable Chairman Francisco T. Duque III, signed the Executive Order No. 864 including the Chairman of the CSC as an *Ex Officio* member in the Board of Directors of Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), Employees' Compensation Commission (ECC), Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PHIC) and Home Development Mutual Fund (Pag-ibig Fund).
- On January 11, 2010, President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo appointed Sec. Duque as Chairman of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) making him an automatic *Ex Officio* member of the Development Academy of the Philippines. Not much later, he was confirmed by the Commission on Appointments on February 03, 2010.
- On May 8, 2007, Sec. Duque was appointed Presidential Oversight Chair of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO).
- On April 3, 2007, Sec. Duque was appointed Anti-Hunger Czar as Chair of the National Nutrition Council (NNC) tasked by the President to oversee the hunger mitigation program implementation of 27 government agencies.
- On June 01, 2005, President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo appointed him as Secretary of the Department of Health.
- In October 2004 President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo appointed him as a member of her Cabinet with the rank of Secretary while serving as PhilHealth President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO).
- In June 2001 her Excellency President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo appointed him as President & CEO of the PHIC – now and under his stewardship, the nation's largest social security institution of government in terms of membership (membership base of 64M Filipinos larger than GSIS & SSS combined).

Pres. and CEO Duque initiated and directed PhilHealth's Plan 500/GMA Indigent Program which has been adopted as one of the State of the Nation Address (SONA) pledges of Pres. Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo. Plan 500 Indigent Program was an enabling program which fast tracked the enrollment of 500,000 urban poor beneficiaries into the National Health Insurance Plan (NHIP) in one (1) year. He successfully exceeded his target by 500% via the enrollment of 2.5M urban poor beneficiaries and about 2M rural indigent beneficiaries. National dailies columnists like Prof. Solita Monsod graded this performance of PHIC under the stewardship of Dr. Duque as one being the highest and one of top five SONA

performers last July 2002. As of August 2002, PHIC has extended health insurance coverage to 5.5M urban and rural poor, for the first time in the history of Medicare and Philhealth. By 2003, indigent enrollment totaled 8M beneficiaries in the NHIP.

Realizing the escalating and prohibitive cost of health care and its extreme poverty converting effects, President GMA dubbed PHIC as one of the "most effective poverty alleviation programs" of government by shifting and reducing the burden of out-of-pocket expenditures especially by the poor towards social health insurance (PhilHealth). This was articulated in her post SONA speech before the 54,000 urban poor gathered in the Quirino grandstand last July 24, 2002.

- During the cabinet meeting of October 10, 2002, Pres. GMA announced that PhilHealth is the " No.1 showcase of her administration" in terms of health security and poverty alleviation agenda.
- Under the leadership of Pres. Duque, PhilHealth successfully implemented the enrollment of 5.9 million families or 29,901,890 beneficiaries under the GMA Sponsored/Plan5-25 Program by 2004.
- Served as the Permanent Representative of then Vice-President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo and concurrently DSWD Secretary, to the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PHIC) Board of Directors from 1999-2001.
- As Chairman of the Philippine Social Security Association (PHILSSA, member associations include SSS, GSIS, HDMF, ECC, PCSO, OWWA, AFPRSBS, PHIC), Chairman Duque initiated and conducted the first ever National Convention on Social Security, February 2-3, 2004 at the Philippine International Convention Center. He raised social awareness on the importance of social security protection program and policies.
- His impeccable background can be best summed up in few words – an Educator, Civic Leader and a Health Care Provider.
