Project Description:	<p>The Master in Public Management (MPM) Online is a 39-unit interdisciplinary graduate program for public sector practitioners and professionals. It incorporates the Academy's distinctive features of combining both theoretical and practical cum functional competencies, as well as building stewardship values.</p>
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Program graduates are envisioned to be reform implementers and effective public managers who will serve as change catalysts in their respective areas or agencies.

The MPM uses and includes adult and experiential-based learning, interactive sessions with experts and practitioners, field exposures, and an action oriented thesis scheme that combines scientific research with program development and implementation. Its major learning areas involve strengthening scientific and technical knowledge and skills on one hand, and developing personal and managerial efficacy on the other hand. These cover research, planning and implementation of programs on health sector reform and other related initiatives. Students are honed on scientific as well as managerial approaches and tools for pursuing reforms and proposing strategic solutions to problems and concerns in the public sector.



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Project Objective: The general objective of this Program is to enhance the overall capabilities of the participants in playing their complex roles and performing multi-dimensional duties and functions as Career Executive Service Officers, committed leaders or ordinary team players in their organization to which they belong.

Its specific objectives are to:

1. Critically examine public and development issues and concerns that confront public servants at the national and local /municipal level;
2. Holistically understand the causes and factors that bear on development issues and concerns;
3. Select and apply appropriate leadership and management strategies in designing, planning, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating public policies, programs, projects, and interventions at the local /municipal level, and
