III. Project Details

Project Description: The Course on Advanced Monitoring and Evaluation (CAME) aims to provide participants with a broader and deeper understanding of M&E, focusing on program results-based monitoring and evaluation. It aims to enhance their knowledge and skills in designing and managing program evaluation, employing appropriate tools, methods, and techniques. By the end of this course, participants are expected to develop a well-defined program evaluation term of reference (TOR).

Project Objective: At the end of the course, the participants will be able to (1) understand the fundamental concepts and principles of results-based monitoring and evaluation, and how they relates to the promotion of a results-oriented public sector management, (2) develop a theory of change and results framework with corresponding indicators for measuring program goals, outcomes, and outputs, (3) use appropriate evaluation design, methods, and tools in data collection and analysis; and develop terms of reference (TOR) for an evaluation study.

IV. Project Accomplishments

Key Activities Implemented: (1) project team meetings, (2) faculty meetings, (3) conduct of training, (4) debriefing meeting

Project Impact: The CFG-PRO was able to capacitate 49 participants from 14 different national government agencies, state universities and colleges, government-owned-and-controlled corporations and local government unit. Participants gained knowledge of the fundamental concepts and principles of results-based monitoring and evaluation while through workshops, the participants gained skills in drafting a Theory of Change, Results-based Framework, and Terms of Reference. They developed



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practical skills in applying these concepts to create and present effective results-based monitoring and evaluation in program management.

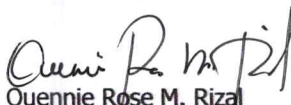
Lessons Learned:

- The revision in course design must be done ahead of time to ensure that the preparation for implementation will be according to the timeline. It will also assure that there will be more time to engage different RPs given that the last quarter of the year is quite a high time for other engagements.
- Schedule the public offerings not later than October to have more time to prepare the official receipts and certificates of the participants before the closing of financial books. This also avoid urgency in liquidation among our participants.
- Ensure that there will be a backup plan in case of expiration of Zoom Premium subscription of DAP.
