Project Description: The Study Mission is an attempt to explore the potentials for a demonstration project on Food Waste Recycling and Composting & Carbon Farming in the Philippines. It will serve as an introduction to Food Waste Recycling as a Circular Economy Strategy, contributing towards efforts for a NetZero 2050, with potential application in tourism services, agriculture, manufacturing, solid & liquid waste management.

Project Objective: The study-mission specifically aims to provide the ROC delegation with a comprehensive overview of the food waste problem in the Philippines, study first-hand the on-going initiatives aimed at addressing it, and scan for potential partnerships between the relevant organizations and the CPC.

Key Activities Implemented: Training on Food Waste Recycling, Study Mission Visits within Metro Manila and Central Luzon.

Major Outputs: Total of 6 out of 6 site visits conducted. Training on Food Waste Recycling successfully implemented, knowledge-exchange between Taiwanese delegates and PH sites facilitated, with the study mission documented. Terminal output submitted to client (APO).

Project Impact: Total of 17 Public Sector participants (11 Female and 6 Male), 3 Private Sector participants (1 Female, 2 Males).

Lessons Learned: Earlier sharing of list of participants to better calibrate the presentations with the audience is recommended. Earlier draft and approval of CPC poster for social media dissemination,

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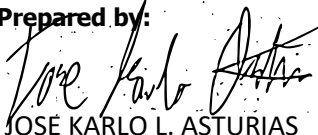
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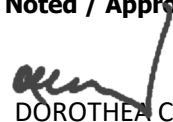
