Project Description: The Master in Public Management (MPM) is a 39-unit interdisciplinary graduate program for development practitioners both in the public and private sectors. It incorporates the Academy's distinctive features of combining both theoretical and practical cum functional competencies, as well as building stewardship values.

Graduates are envisioned to be effective, ethical and transformative public managers, change catalysts and reform implementers, visionary, meta-strategic thinker, clear and agile leaders, sustainable development managers, and phronetic civil servants with shared value for national development.

The MPM focuses on adult and experiential-based learning, and includes interactive sessions with experts and practitioners, field exposures, and an action-oriented thesis scheme that combines scientific research with program development and implementation. Its major learning areas involve strengthening scientific and technical knowledge and skills on one hand, and developing personal and managerial efficacy and leadership on the other hand.

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Project Objective:	The general objective of the MPM program is to enhance the capabilities of the students in playing their complex roles and performing multi-dimensional duties and functions as public managers, committed leaders or ordinary team players in the organization to which they belong. Through the program, students shall be able to: 1. Critically examine public and development issues and concerns that confront public servants at the international, national and local levels; 2. Holistically understand the causes and factors that affect development issues and concerns; 3. Select and apply appropriate leadership and management strategies in designing, planning, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating public policies, programs, projects, and interventions at the national and local levels; and 4. Live out the principles of effective, efficient and ethical public governance, such as transparency and accountability, integrity, and commitment to public service, among others.
