This is a twinning program between DAP-GSPDM and the Philippine Air Force Officer School (PAFOS). The Executive Course in Public Management is conducted in alignment with the PAFOS' Squadron Officer Course. It is composed of two modules as follows:

Research Module:

This course introduces students to the fundamental research process, methodologies and techniques in public management. It covers qualitative, quantitative and mixed methods of data collection and analysis. It shall equip students with the critical analysis and proficiency in conducting basic research.

Management Module:

This course illustrates the concepts, principles, and theories of public management and what their values are in dealing with issues and challenges of public organizations. With public management concepts, principles, and theories as foundation, the course gives emphasis on the effective performance of the specific managerial tasks and challenges on economic evaluations and project management.

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Project Objective:

The course objectives are as follows:

Research Module:

1. Explain the different research methods and techniques.
2. Apply appropriate methodological approaches to public management research.
3. Write a research paper in public management.

Management Module:

1. Comprehend the meaning, nature, functions, and challenges of organizational management and relate the same to the systems, processes, and challenges in the organization they belong to;
2. Understand public management principles, how they evolved, and what their values are in a manager's role of steering public organizations to fundamentally serve the public interests;
3. Explain the value of economic analysis in making managerial decisions;
4. Perform both cost-benefit and cost-effectiveness analyses and use the outputs from the same in making managerial decisions;
5. Appreciate the value of the logical framework approach and use the same particularly in project planning;
6. Value forecasting as it relates to a manager's role of developing a futuristic organization; and
7. Understand the dynamics and processes involved in program development and management and be able to outline a simple project plan
